Industria Commons

The former Corbin Heights was a densely packed public housing development made up of over 400 residential units arranged in more than 50 drab and mundane masonry buildings.

A comprehensive redevelopment resulted in 235 modern apartment homes in a transformed community newly branded as Industria Commons.

Development Challenges

- Negative public perception and stigma associated with former community
- Active community and resident support necessary to assemble public financing
- Community and unit designs to accommodate mobility issues and allow residents to age in place
- Intricate construction phasing required to minimize resident disruption and relocation
- Safety paramount during demolition and construction activities in an occupied residential neighborhood
